4. Are there any questions that have been raised from the talk?

1. Discuss your food etiquette with the group. Where did you learn this and why do you behave in a particular way? Are there some things that everyone agrees are acceptable or unacceptable?

2. What is Paul's first challenge to Christians in 1Tim2? Why do you think this is so important?
3. What does Paul want men to do? (v8) Why do you think he has demanded this of men?
4. What does Paul want women to do? (v9-10) Why is this Paul's instruction to women?
5. How should we understand Paul's instructions for authority in the church? (v11-15)
Note: Let's be gracious and loving, keeping in mind Paul's wisdom, desire to encourage Christians in worship, and his reasoning from Genesis 1-3 and God's created order.
6. How has your understanding of the gospel and Christian living been altered from 1Tim2?

4. List the responsibilities of deacons. (v8-13) *Note: 'Deacon' essentially means a servant.*
5. Why does Paul place such big emphasis on the way church leaders and members should be living? How does this relate to us?
6. How has 1Tim3 shaped your understanding of what it means to be a Christian?
